Epiphany Runs on 100% Green Electricity

Parish of the Epiphany runs on 100% fossil-free electricity today! For over 3 years, Parish of the Epiphany has sourced its electricity from <u>WinPower 100</u> (the 100% renewable municipal electric aggregation program in Winchester). WinPower 100 electricity is generated from New England solar, wind and low-impact hydro sources. It supplies green electricity for both the Rectory and Parish building. Over 180 homes and businesses today use WinPower, and in 3 years it has saved over 7.2 million pounds of CO2, the equivalent of taking 700 cars off the road for a year.) Renewable Electricity Poised to Eclipse Coal in the US



For the first time ever, the US is on track to produce more electricity this year from renewable power than coal. This has been driven by economics. The cost of building large wind farms has declined more than 40% since 2010, while solar costs have dropped more than 80%. And the price of natural gas has fallen to historic lows

The Coronavirus has sharply reduced demand for electricity. And, because coal plants often cost more to operate than gas plants or renewables, many utilities are cutting back on coal power first in response. Read more in this NYT article: https://bit.ly/NYT-green
